If there is a discrepancy, please turn to the programme coordinators. As for *Thesis Writing* (ANOD-SZD), this is actually a record of your thesis consultation (not graded) and meant to be taken in the second semester.

- What if there are not enough places in NEPTUN for a compulsory course? Please turn to the course tutor and ask for the class limit to be raised. If there are problems, let the programme coordinators know, as well.

Thesis:

- **Does the thesis have to be empirical, classroom research-based?** You are encouraged to relate the thesis research closely to your school practice and include an element of teacher or action research. However, it is also possible to write a thesis that is predominantly literature-based.
- Does the thesis title have to be in English or Hungarian or both? According to university regulations, the title is to be provided both in English and Hungarian. You may turn to your supervisor or your Hungarian peers for help with this.
- What does submitting a thesis title proposal actually involve? Consult your supervisor and agree about a thesis title. Upload your title in NEPTUN by the deadline (15 October 2024). The supervisor will then approve the title in NEPTUN.
- What is the minimum length of the thesis (how many characters, with or without spaces)?

- What is the length of the literature review compared to the whole thesis? There is no specific requirement. Consult your supervisor.
- What is the thesis admission request? The supervisor has to approve the upload of the thesis in NEPTUN. Please remind them to do so. Here you will find a step-by-step description in English: <u>https://www.btk.elte.hu/en/content/thesis-information.t.6125</u>.
- How do I upload the thesis? The thesis will have to be uploaded in NEPTUN. Here you will find a step-bystep description in English: <u>https://www.btk.elte.hu/en/content/thesisinformation.t.6125</u>.
- Do I have to pay anything if I decide to postpone submitting my thesis, say, by a term?

No, you don't. Once a student has completed all course work (*absolutorium* in Hungarian), their studies will be officially closed, and their status set to *coursework completed* / *"abszolvált"* in Neptun. As you are no longer an active student, everything that is related to *active student status* also ends: you cannot register for any courses, apply for a student residence permit, or receive a scholarship. You do not pay a tuition fee, either.

However, you can still request a thesis title change, submit a thesis, and apply for and take the Final Exam (students can register for the Final Exam until 5

years after they obtain their *absolutorium*.) This applies to all students (self-paying, scholarship holder, Hungarian, international).

But please note: The Thesis Writing seminar (ANOD-SZD) is a 5-credit study unit and, therefore, part of the curriculum. This means there is no *absolutorium* without completing this subject. If you do not get a grade for this seminar in your second semester, you have to extend your scholarship/pay tuition fee for one more semester.

However, submitting the thesis is **not** a prerequisite of getting a grade for the *Thesis Writing seminar*. When in doubt, ask your supervisor what you have to do to get a grade. If you get a grade without submitting the thesis, you can get the "*abszolvált*" status, despite the fact that you still need thesis consultation.

Exams:

- Are there any topics for the oral proficiency exam to prepare for? You will be made familiar with the structure and content of the oral exam as part of the Professional Language Development for Instructors course (ANOD-103).

In this case, a (fictitious) exam has to be offered and <u>you have to sign</u> <u>up for it</u> but it is actually not taken. You will still receive a grade based on your work during the course.
